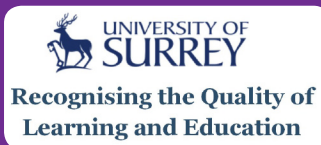

- Identify the risks and benefits involved with the use of a syringe driver.
- Gain an awareness of medication compatibility and conversions associated with oral to subcutaneous administration.
